Message from Pastor Joyce Royal

It's Easter time again and the time of Lent is here, and it certainly seems like we are just getting through Christmas and all the "overeating" and "present giving". In Lent, many Christians commit to **fasting**, as well as giving up certain luxuries in order to replicate the account of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey into the desert for 40 days. This is commonly known as one's Lenten sacrifice and completely opposite of what most people do at Christmas. The Lenten time starts with Ash Wednesday, which is February 26, this year. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Lent is a season of reflection and preparation before the celebrations of Easter. Fasting is the act of doing with less, but sometimes we can do more than just give up something for Lent. We can add something to our daily routine to make the time of Lent more enjoyable for us as well as others who may not partake in fasting. When we give up something that we do daily, we add more time to our day to be available to help others. So, what if we add saying a prayer for someone to our Lenten time. I like to send cards to shut ins from my church family during this time. A note or a card can be as helpful to them as fasting is to us. The time of Lent, through fasting and abstaining, may be an important reminder of what it means to suffer. This small suffering should not be met with misery, but with great joy as we better understand the suffering that people who have no one feel at this time of the year. What joy we can bring to someone when they receive a phone call, a note or card, or maybe even an invitation to a meal when they are otherwise lonely.

This year at North Main United Methodist we will be starting our Wednesday evening Lenten Services on **Ash Wednesday, February 26th, at 6:00.** The next Wednesday services will be provided by the Lay Ministry Team. This is an exciting time for them to do the service and learn more about preparing sermons as they will be starting their next Ministry Class in March, "Called to Preach". I hope you will come and support them as you have myself. Maybe that's what you can do for Lent. Add to the support of the Lay Ministry Team and pray for them as they move forward in sharing this year's series entitled "Go Forth for Jesus".

In addition we will be starting our Lenten Bible Study "Invitation to the Old Testament" which starts on February 19, at 2:00. This will be a class participation series with beautifully illustrated scenes of the Holy Land and the Old Testament readings. I am looking forward to learning more about why we

January Food Pantry Report

We started off this year much the same as we did in 2019. It was cold and blustery. Our volunteers were as always faithful in their duty. Today we had 2 newly certified volunteers helping us, David Kibbe and Kayce Frederick. Pastor Joyce presented the required Civil Rights training on Friday January 17th so that they were able to help with this first distribution of 2020. Tom Kevlin and Carol Johnson also took the workshop. Tom will be helping later in the year. We appreciate the extra time that these people put in to help with this mission.

At this distribution we were able to serve 44 families including 1 new family. We provided food for 64 adults, 23 children and 13 seniors. A total of 100 members of our community were provided with

food. 32 families participated in the pet food mission this month. We were able to provide food for 33 dogs and 44 cats, so a total of 77 animals benefited from the pet food mission.

Our building seems to be holding its own. Both the equipment and the heating system are functioning very well. We are looking forward to having our floors installed so that distribution day will be made much easier. We are continuing to take advantage of all the USDA food that we can order from the Regional Food Bank. This really helps to keep our costs down and it allows us to supply our members with healthy options. As an example, I was able to order 2 lb. blocks of cheese and quarts of shelf stable 1% milk for February at no cost.

We appreciate our caring congregation and Pastor Joyce for all that they do, both financially and physically, to keep this mission going forward. Without this support it would not survive.

Our next pantry day is February 17th. The Food Pantry is looking forward to a successful, healthy and safe 2020.
