It's Graduation time again and for North Main UMC that offered us another chance to do the Baccalaureate Service for Gloversville High School graduating seniors. Prayer Shawls



Food Pantry Report - May

The weather was sunny quite warm for pantry day. The turnout was very busy for the first hour or so. We had 85 families which included 115 adults, 51 children and 62 seniors. We had 14 new families this month.

We gave out a choice of fish sticks, chicken patties or Italian sausage patties. Everyone received ground beef along with cheese, butter, and eggs. The dry bags had canned vegetables and fruit, peanut butter, instant potatoes, and tuna. There were the choices of cold cereal, juice, and shelf stable milk. We also had coffee, ketchup, and mayonnaise. We will be restocking before the next month's pantry.

Our pet ministry is still doing very well. We had food requests for 26 dogs and 62 cats. We will be restocking with the monies that have been donated. I was able to get a good supply of diapers in assorted sizes this month which was very well received. We also had a small supply of baby food.

Pastor Joyce, along with pantry volunteers Jan, Marilyn and myself, watched a demonstration for the new computer program we will be instituting in the coming months to make registration easier.

Food Pantry Report - June

The weather was hot on pantry day. The turnout was very busy for the first hour or so. We had 84 families, which included 115 adults, 45 children and 69 seniors. We had 13 new families this month.

We gave out chicken breasts, hot dogs, cheese and butter. The dry bags had canned vegetables and applesauce, peanut butter, stuffing mix, macaroni and cheese, and pork and beans. There were choices of cold cereal, juice and shelf stable milk. We also had oil or mayonnaise along with coffee. We will be restocking before the next month's pantry.

Our pet ministry is still doing very well. We had food requests for 31 dogs and 43 cats. We will be restocking with the monies that have been donated. I was able to get a small supply of diapers in assorted sizes and this was very well received.

Again, thanks to all who donate to the funding of our pantry and to those who work so hard to make our pantry a success. We thank God that we have the chance to help those in our community who are in need. Trying to keep the costs down while getting enough food items for those in need is ongoing. We are thankful for the grant money we have received and for those who put the work into applying for them.

Pastor Joyce, along with pantry volunteers Jan, Marilyn and myself, will attend a training session at the Food Bank for the new computer program we will be instituting in the coming months to make registration easier. Onward and Upward! Thank you.


