This month we gave out hot dogs, ground beef, cheese, eggs, and butter in the cold bags. We gave out the dry bags that had the usual canned vegetables and fruit, along with peanut butter, pasta. There were the choices of cold cereal, juice, and shelf stable milk. We also had mayonnaise, oil, ketchup, mustard, and salad dressings for the extra choices. As usual, we will be restocking before the next month's pantry.

Our pet ministry is still doing very well. We had requests for only 29 cats and 34 dogs. We will restock for next month also. We still have a small supply of diapers in assorted sizes for those requests.

Again, thanks to all those who donate to the funding of our pantry and those who work so hard to make our pantry a success. We thank God that we have the chance to help those in our community who are in need. We are thankful for the grant money we have received and those who put the work into applying for them.
