This year, like many years before, poinsettia plants will fill the alter at North Main UMC. Have you ever wondered why we do this? The shape of the **poinsettia** flower and leaves are sometimes thought as a symbol of the Star of Bethlehem which led the Wise Men to Jesus. The red colored leaves symbolize the blood of Christ. The white leaves represent his purity. It wasn't until about 1836 that the plant formally attained its popular name of "Poinsettia" after the man who first brought the plant to the United States and ignited a holiday tradition that continues to this day. This is one tradition we can continue this year as many years before.

Our Christmas services will be different this year in all the churches throughout the world as well as at North Main. As we proceed toward the end of 2020, most of us have great expectations for 2021. This has been a year like no other year before. But the Christmas message is still the same. Part of the wonder of the story of Jesus is how the ancient message is made new. When the people went streaming into the desert to hear John the Baptist preach, it wasn't for the novelty of the message that they went. They had heard the words before. Rather, they went for the power of old words made new. Same message as before, but with a new meaning. John's presence and preaching made the ancient message fresh. Jesus, of course, did one better and made the ancient message flesh in the form of a tiny baby wrapped in swaddling clothes. John's message of expectation was powerful, and precisely because of its familiarity, just like it is today. The wilderness, of all places, is where the gospel of Jesus Christ begins. That new message is rooted in the old message that God's delivering of his people always begins in the wilderness. This is the old message made new today. This year we will be delivered in a totally different way as we continue to experience the pandemic that is affecting the entire world.

As the old message it is still ever new, for each time it is preached, we can still feel the presence of Jesus Christ at Christmas. This is the same message we have all heard many times before, but this year may it have a new message for all us. This old message may just be the new message we have been waiting for. May it be so this year more than any other year before.

Merry Christmas to Everyone and may the year 2021 be a year of new beginnings for all of us.

RED BIRD MISSION 'CARAVAN'

This year's trip to the Red Bird Mission was very successful. We took 2,025 shoeboxes filled with personal hygiene items, 25 boxes of diapers, over 75 new sheet sets, over 100 backpacks filled with school supplies, handmade scarves, and other miscellaneous items. We drove one 26-foot truck to Kentucky and intend to take another 26-foot truck with clothing and food sometime in March of 2021.

This year we kept a record of the hours and miles put into this mission. Our drivers drove approximately 4,662 miles picking up donations throughout the Upper New York Conference and driving to Kentucky. The team spent over 400 hours on this mission.

North Main St. UMC Food Pantry Monthly Report – December 20

It was another cold day for the pantry but we had planned on the weather. We had all the foods bagged up for quick movement of those needing food. Pastor Joyce took names outside and gave out sign-up sheets so there was not a delay in intake.

We had a snag in our order that was due on the 18th. The Regional Bank had to cancel the order due to the storm that hit on Thursday. We had all the items we needed for the pantry but could not give the eggs or apples that were ordered. With the hams and fish sticks along with the dry bag items, I think everyone received a good selection of foods. Our previous order was 11182 lbs. of food so we had a good amount on hand.

We had 72 families attend which included 14 new families. There were 102 adults, 36 children and 42 seniors that the food will feed.

The pet ministry serviced 54 families with 59 dogs and 74 cats.

I plan on making up a report in January to summarize the year's pantry orders along with the totals reported each month.
