Dear Congregation at North Main Street UMC

Jesus spoke in parables many times to try to get his message through to the people. Jesus spoke to them again in parables, saying: "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his servants to those who had been invited to the banquet to tell them to come, but they refused to come. In New Testament times, a wedding was a very sacred and joyous thing. Some even lasted up to more than a week. When Jesus told this parable, many people were able to understand the picture he was trying to create because we've all done this, declined invitations. Sometimes our ill health or injury gets in the way; other times we are in sorrow. There are a whole host of reasons we decline invitations. There are so many ways God invites us to celebrate and then to serve. But it is easy for us to get side-tracked. Needing to work on Sundays can be a block to attending the celebration; having family responsibilities, even if they are sports or other social events, can get in the way. What have we gained by accepting God's invitation to the banquet? What have we lost? Jesus is still speaking to us today to come to the feast that has been prepared for each of us. We may even say to ourselves that we do not need anything. No one has to pray for me! All my prayers are answered! I don't need anything. Maybe, just maybe, we might be wrong? We think we have it all. We don't need to have others pray for us. We still maintain that the demands of living in today's "day and age" determine our responses. That may be the reason but isn't it wonderful that God does not use excuses to exclude us from God's love and goodness. God never declines our prayers, even though our impatience tells us that we want an answer and we want it right now. God does answer – we just have to be ready to listen. We just have to come to the banquet of God's healing love. We need to stop and say, "I am in the need of prayer". When God hears us and answers us saying, "Prayer is a way of you talking to me; sharing everything on your heart, your joys and your fears." There will never be a time when we are alone when we are in tune with God.

Today, more than ever, we need to take the time to come to the banquet that God has prepared for us. The world that is created for each of us is there for us to enjoy. When we get the invitation to come to the banquet that has been prepared for us, we need to respond in a positive way. We need to drop everything that seems to be important and come to the sacred and joyous event that God has put on for all of us. Worship can be an opportunity to consider again what it is that is worth occupying our minds and our time.

The Lord has given to each of us gifts and abilities. We are blessed by God with these gifts that we may share them every day to help others. In God's love and healing powers we are strengthened to be of service to others. North Main Street UMC is a missional giving church. God goes with us in our ministries. We do not need to brag about what we do because God is with us wherever we are and knows our good works. Praise be to God who is present and walks by our side daily even when we sometimes fail to listen. Amen

FOOD PANTRY REPORT

It was a chilly day for our pantry but we had a larger turnout than last month. We had 13 new families and 2 renewals for a total of 15 new families.

Pantry day we had 59 families attend with a total of 61 for the month thru 10/19. There were 100 adults, 43 children and 28 seniors. I noticed an increased number of young adults there this month,

The pet ministry had 49 families with 48 dogs and 97 cats.

All in all, it was a good day and with the inclusion of the Nar-Can training and Planned Parenthood tables outside those waiting had something to do. Ginger Cato from HFM Prevention tabled with us and provided 10 people with Nar-can training. Again, God has blessed our ministry.









RED BIRD MISSION Christmas Shoe Boxes

Red Bird Mission, located in Beverly, Kentucky, is the most comprehensive mission effort of the United Methodist Church. Started in 1921 they have been providing ministries that are spiritual, physical, social and economic. Last year, volunteers from Endwell UMC delivered over 3,000 shoeboxes, along with bedding, school supplies, books and cleaning supplies. This year, their goal is to deliver at least 3,600 boxes! Calvary United Methodist Church in Latham has volunteered to be the local collection center and then the boxes will be trucked to Kentucky for distribution.

Judy Antonucci from NMSUMC is our local liaison and she will be picking up donated items and delivering them to Latham on October 28th. All items should be FULL size and in their original containers, as purchased. To help items fit in the box, purchase flat bottles of shampoo, hand lotion, etc. and small round cans of shaving cream. Judy has purchased plastic shoe boxes which will be labeled for a man, woman or child.
