Jesus Sends Out the Twelve Disciples... Luke 9: 1-4 When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority over everything. Food Pantry Report - July

It was another sunny and hot morning for our pantry this month. We had planned for 80 families and we were very surprised with the turnout. We were very busy from the time we started until closing at 1: 00. We ended up with 99 families! There were 138 adults, 51 children and 68 seniors. There seem to be a lot of new visitors in the last couple months, we had 22 this month.

We had frozen pulled pork, hamburger, butter and cheese for the first 80 or so people. We had some hot dogs and fish sticks once we ran out of the pork. We were lucky that we had enough inventory to cover the last people. We will be restocking this week so that we will have enough for next month.

Our pet ministry is still doing well. We had food requests for 47 dogs and 79 cats. We have received monetary donations for pet food and now have a supply of both cat and dog food on hand. Our thanks to all those who have contributed.

Food Pantry Report - August

This month's pantry was another busy one. We had planned for 90 families since we had had so many last month. We were again surprised with the turnout. We were very busy from the time we started until closing at 1:00. We ended up with 103 families! There were 142 adults, 65 children and 71 seniors. There seems to be a growing need in the area. We had 18 new visitors this month.

We gave out whole chickens, hot dogs, ravioli, and cheese. When the chickens were gone we had hamburger to give out and some hot dogs and fish sticks once we ran out of the rest. We were lucky that we had enough inventory to cover the last people. We will be restocking before the next pantry day.

Our pet ministry is still doing well. We had food requests for 56 dogs and 90 cats. We have received monetary donations for pet food and will need to restock there also. Our thanks to all those who have contributed.

Thanks to all those who donate to the funding of our pantry and those who work so hard to make our pantry a success. We thank God that we have the chance to help those in our community who are in need. I am concentrating on keeping the costs down while getting enough food items for those in need.

The food bank is starting a new computerized accounting program which we will be looking into to allow for easier record keeping in the future. More information will follow.

Neighborhood Engagement Event

Even if you don't own a firearm, you can learn valuable information and we encourage anyone concerned about gun safety to attend.

We will bring our ingredients. They have pans, utensils, stove, oven and refrigerator there. The goal is to have a meal ready to serve at 3. In the past we have seen a number of single teen aged moms and expectant moms attending. The first meal will be Wednesday, September 6.
